STYLE

- 1 Follow the sort of style used in recent JCMCC or **Ars Combinatoria** in general.
- 2 A short abstract is preferred. Neither keywords nor MR classification is shown.
- 3 References should be numbered in alphabetical order and referred to by number: for example,

...Smith [3] showed...

and consistently use one of the following bibliographic styles:

[3] A Smith, *A theorem in combinatorics*. J. Graph Theory 9(1999), 9-99.

[3] A Smith, A theorem in combinatorics. *J. Graph Theory* 9(1999), 9-99.

- 4 The author's address should follow the author's name, and should be a **usable postal address** – with zipcode, for example. The address should be run on to form one or two lines. An e-mail address, if desired, should follow the address; use the `\tt` font class. Including a temporary address as well as the permanent one is often a good idea.

PREPARATION

If you follow our style and produce your paper on a word processor, it may be possible to print directly from the manuscript, or at least to construct our version by modifying your file slightly. This reduces both costs and the probability of introduction of errors at our end.

Ideally your paper should be prepared in LATEX or some other flavor of TEX. The page size should be 4.5 x 7.125 inches (11.4 x 18.1 cm) in 10 point type. The text should be single-spaced, without excessive white spaces. *Do not add additional space between lines.*

In LATEX, use documentclass *article* (and stylefiles *amssymb* and *amsmath* if desired); use `\maketitle`, with `\title{\bf <Your title>}` and `\date{}`; specify `\pagestyle{empty}`. Leave `\baselinestretch` at 1 (unless you make a temporary change, for display purposes). *Do not* use a specialized document class; in particular, the AMS style (as in class *amsart*) is quite different from ours and involves extensive rewriting because of the various commands introduced in it.
